## **WTC Quarterly Meetings**

Our last committee meeting was held on Friday, February 3, 2017. The meeting was conducted via conference call due to winter weather prohibiting an on-site meeting at the City of Camas slow sand filtration plant. The next committee meeting is scheduled for Friday, May 5, 2017 at the PNWS AWWA conference in Kennewick, WA.

#### 2017 PNWS AWWA Annual Conference

The committee is sponsoring two technical sessions covering a broad range of treatment topics; an early bird session; and a half day pre-con with treatment plant tours of the Kennewick Columbia River Water Treatment Plant and the West Pasco Water Treatment Plant.

Bus transportation for the pre-con has been arranged with the LAC. HDR, CH2M, and Apollo Inc have all graciously agreed to sponsor the bus transportation.

#### **Annual Water Treatment Committee Forums**

Per previous committee reports, the committee feels there may be more value in focusing our resources on supporting the various short schools and/or collaborating with other committees on training.
