# What it is

- World Water Corps is a voluntary arm of Water For People
- Uses skills from North America strategically to fill gaps in program work that cannot be filled in-country
- Augments and supports, as needed, the capacity of Water For People in the USA





# What it is not



- The World Water Corps is not for volunteers wanting to construct community water supply and sanitation systems!

# Building Capacity, not Systems

Building systems is rewarding, tangible, but...

- ✓ Are the systems sustainable?
- ✓ Are all the key local role players involved or just the community and maybe an NGO?
- ✓ Are back-up issues of maintenance and replacement addressed?
- ✓ Is it consistent with Water For People's approach?
- ✓ Does it undermine local contributions to development?
- ✓ Is this the best use of Water For People's network?



# Opportunities to Enhance Sustainability

## Regular Opportunities

- Monitoring of program work (annual)
- Evaluations (every country every 3 years)
- Mapping/Needs Assessments (every 2 years)

## Country-Specific Needs

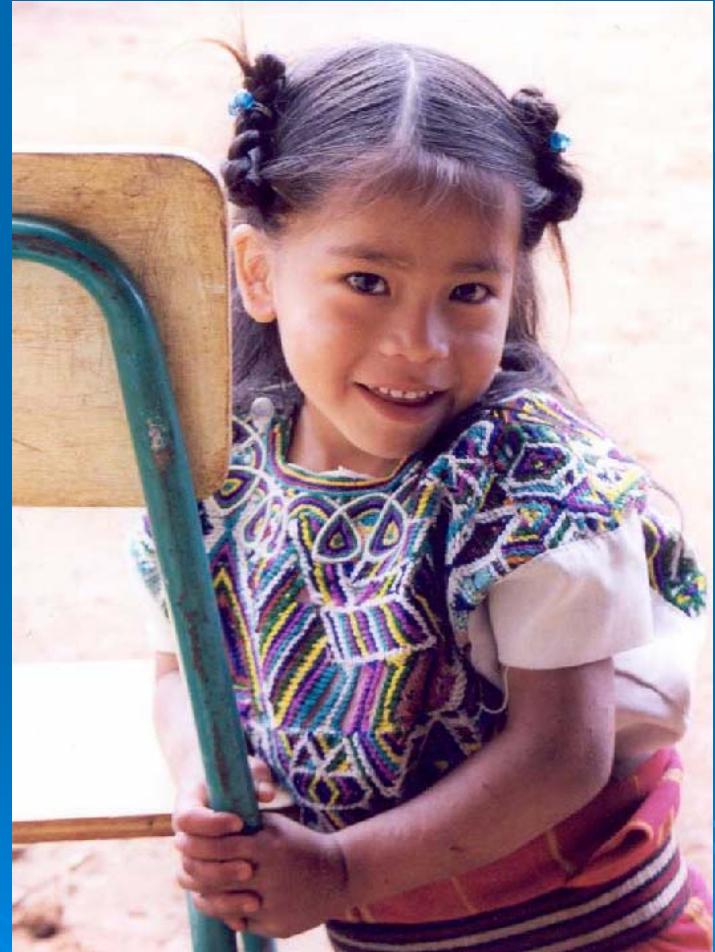
Examples include:

- Hydrogeology in Honduras

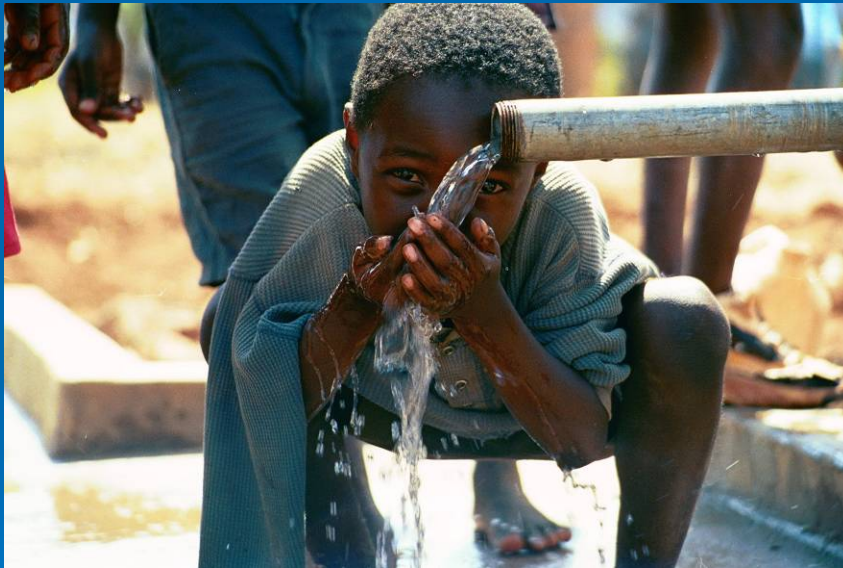


# To Date
